Management Objectives:

The landowner has expressed three main objectives for this property

Current objectives are:

- Aesthetic privacy value. The landowner would like to maintain this property in a mostly wooded state to preserve the current aesthetic characteristics of the property
- Forest improvement/growth. The landowner would like to improve the health of the existing forest and to promote the growth and regeneration of limber species.
- Roads. The landowner would like to construct a driveway through an adjoining parcel to access the property.

Resource Assessment:

Soil and Terrain Character:

second largest soil complex found on the property is the Gilpin silt loam (12 to 20 percent slopes) (GnD). The smallest soil type on the property is the Wernock silt loam (5 to 12 percent slopes) (LgC). The property can be described as a drain with a prominent eastern slope. Most of the soils on the property are a Gilpin-Petros complex (20 to 35 percent slopes) (GpH). The

maple, Scarlet oak, Chestnut oak, Black cherry, White oak, Sourwood, Hickory, Northern red oak of pulpwood. The timber species composition on the property consists of Yellow-poplar, Red old. The sawtimber across the rest of the property is fairly sparce, constituting a significant amount diameter at breast height (DBH) of 15-18." This sawtimber appears to be between 80-100 years side of the property. This sawtimber has an average merchantable height of 32-40' with an average Most of the quality sawtimber on the property is isolated to the highest elevations on the western Virginia pine, Bastern hemlock, White pine, and American beech Stand Descriptions

Red maple, Sourwood, American beech, Virginia pine, Blackgum, Sweetgum. The understory remains consistent across the property and includes American holly, White pine,

Overall, forest health is poor to moderate. Timber growth and regeneration on the property seems slightly slower than normal. Most of the mature timber on the western side of the property seems relatively healthy. The health of the forest is to be expected based on the age, site quality, soft characteristics, topography, past land use, and geographic location.

Forest Management Recommendations:

The following forest management activities are recommended over the next ten (10) years.

- Monitor for invasive forest insects such as Gypsy Moth and Asian Long-Horned Beetle. Stay informed of any updates of outbreaks in Morgan County.
- Monitor for invasive forest plants of elevated risk such as Multiflora rose, Mirnosa, Paulownia, Autumn olive, Allanthus, Chinese privet, Japanese honeysuckle, and Bradford pear.
- Revaluate forest management plen in the year 2033.

Additional Management Recommendations:

The following additional management activities are recommended annually over the next ten (10) years.

- Inspect the property quarterly to help reduce the risk of timber theft, trespass, and other unwanted activities.
- 2. Apply for and thereafter maintain Greenbelt tax assessment to reduce property taxes.
- Document and maintain records of all management activities.
- 4. Maintain gates and other access points to help prevent tresposs.
- Paint the boundary of the property in an oil based paint to reduce the risk of the above unwanted activities.
- Contact Southeastern Forest Management before conducting any timber harvesting or other significant forest management activities.
