McElroy House, c. 1883. An architecturally significant example of the vernacular two-story Victorian farm houses built in Mecklenburg County following the Civil War. Dr. Richard S. Mattson & D. William H. Huffman of the Historic Landmarks Commission documents that the asymmetrical form (*T-Shaped*) stands in contrast to the typical facades of the I-house that predominated in rural Mecklenburg during the 19th century reflecting the emerging preference among well-to-do farmers in the area seeking up-to-date picturesque domestic architecture.

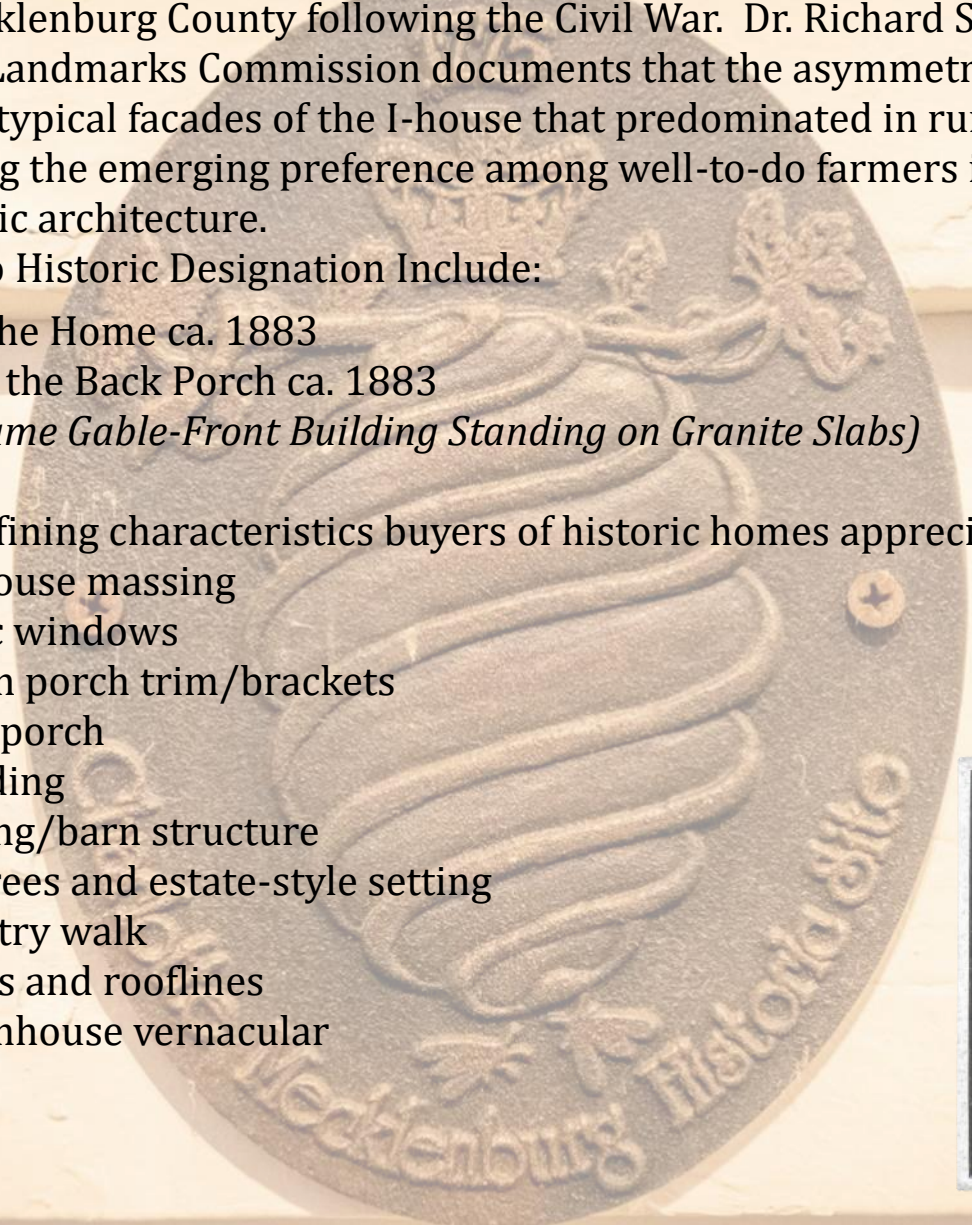

The Samuel J. McElroy House | *A Modern Heritage Home*

A Blend of Historic and Modern Elements. Step into a rare, historically significant home at 10915 Beatties Ford Road, Huntersville, NC. This extraordinary Victorian-era farmhouse, known as the McElroy House (c. 1883), seamlessly combines historic charm with modern luxury on 5 acres of pristine land. The restored home bridges the gap between period significance and modern, functional living. Situated in the Lake Norman area, the property is near Latta Nature Preserve, offering easy access to 16 miles of equestrian, hiking, and biking trails. Enjoy peaceful country living just minutes from Birkdale Village, I-77/I-485, and a short drive to Charlotte and Douglas International Airport. The grounds feature curated landscaping, a saltwater in-ground gunite pool, and hobby farm amenities built to accommodate farm animals of your choice with fencing, pastures, and a barn. The home has been renovated over time; most recently the creation of a designer gourmet kitchen ideal for entertaining. The incremental renovation occurred while preserving character, the 4-bedroom home boasts original hardwoods, ornate woodwork, and a stunning staircase, complemented by the new chef's kitchen featuring a large marble island. This is a true "rare find" that pairs storied history with modern, sophisticated living.

Built 1883 by Samuel Jefferson McElroy of Scots Irish ancestry, part of the family that settled in Cumberland County, PA in 1729 before moving south. McElroy was a Confederate volunteer during the Civil War and fought at Gettysburg where he lost a finger and was taken prisoner. After the war he married Margaret Janet Sample in January 1866. Margaret was a descendant of the Sample family who purchased and owned the Latta Plantation in northern Mecklenburg County for several decades in the mid-19th century. She was the great granddaughter of one of the signers of the Mecklenburg Declaration of Independence, Richard Barry Sr. The McElroy House is located just north of the historic Hopewell Presbyterian Church and the ca. 1800 Latta Plantation.

Unlike the typical, and conservative I-house architecture of the time, the McElroy House is a outstanding example of the T-shaped two-story farmhouses built after the Civil War. *"The McElroy House is among the finest and most intact of a collection of vernacular Victorian, two-story, T-shaped farmhouses to appear in Mecklenburg County (including five along Beatties Ford Road) after the Civil War."*¹

The grounds are shaded by mature oaks and like the home, have a mixture of historical and modern elements. Adjacent to the home is a garage equipped to charge electric vehicles. A fieldstone chimney stands behind the home (perhaps the remains of a summer kitchen). Nearby a tack house (now used as an tool/pool shed) stands on granite slabs. Both stand watch over the large pool/decking and adjacent bocce ball court. In the background an 8-stall traditional barn with 2nd floor hay loft and adjoining chicken coop is available, complemented by a round pen and 3 cross-fenced pastures, ideal for equestrian use.

For generations the McElroy Home has been occupied by the family and direct descendants. Only the third non-family owners, the current owner as well as the previous, were outstanding stewards of this historical gem. They understood that they were more than the "owner", but rather the "temporary keeper" of a property focused on long-term preservation for future generations. Such a relationship involves balancing the preservation of home's original character with the need for modern functionality. Both accomplished this responsibility admirably.
